

CHEROKEE IN GEORGIA HISTORY

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THE STORY OF THE CHEROKEE IN GEORGIA HISTORY IS A PROFOUND AND OFTEN TRAGIC NARRATIVE, DEEPLY INTERWOVEN WITH THE VERY FABRIC OF THE STATE. WE WILL UNCOVER THEIR SOPHISTICATED SOCIETAL STRUCTURES, THEIR AGRICULTURAL PROWESS, THEIR INITIAL ATTEMPTS AT DIPLOMACY AND ASSIMILATION, AND THE UNYIELDING INJUSTICES THAT LED TO THE TRAIL OF TEARS. UNDERSTANDING THE CHEROKEE PRESENCE IN GEORGIA IS CRUCIAL FOR COMPREHENDING THE STATE'S DEVELOPMENT AND THE ONGOING IMPACT OF THIS PIVOTAL CHAPTER.

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A DEEPLY ROOTED PAST: THE ANCESTRAL CHEROKEE HOMELAND IN GEORGIA

THE CHEROKEE PEOPLE HAVE A HISTORY IN GEORGIA THAT PREDATES THE ARRIVAL OF EUROPEAN COLONISTS BY CENTURIES, IF NOT MILLENNIA. THEIR ANCESTRAL HOMELAND ENCOMPASSED A VAST AND FERTILE REGION, ENCOMPASSING MUCH OF WHAT IS NOW NORTHERN GEORGIA, EXTENDING INTO PARTS OF TENNESSEE, NORTH CAROLINA, AND ALABAMA. THIS LAND WAS NOT MERELY TERRITORY; IT WAS THE SOURCE OF THEIR SUSTENANCE, THEIR SPIRITUAL CONNECTION, AND THE FOUNDATION OF THEIR CULTURAL IDENTITY. THE CHEROKEE WERE DEEPLY ATTUNED TO THE RHYTHMS OF THE LAND, UTILIZING ITS RESOURCES SUSTAINABLY THROUGH AGRICULTURE, HUNTING, AND GATHERING.

THE GEOGRAPHICAL FEATURES OF THIS REGION PLAYED A SIGNIFICANT ROLE IN SHAPING CHEROKEE LIFE. THE FERTILE VALLEYS OF THE APPALACHIAN FOOTHILLS PROVIDED IDEAL CONDITIONS FOR CULTIVATING CORN, BEANS, SQUASH, AND OTHER STAPLE CROPS. THE ABUNDANCE OF RIVERS AND STREAMS OFFERED NOT ONLY WATER BUT ALSO OPPORTUNITIES FOR FISHING AND TRANSPORTATION. THE FORESTS PROVIDED GAME AND MATERIALS FOR BUILDING, CRAFTING, AND CEREMONY. THIS DEEP CONNECTION TO THE LAND FOSTERED A PROFOUND RESPECT FOR NATURE AND A COMPLEX UNDERSTANDING OF ITS ECOLOGICAL BALANCE, A CORNERSTONE OF CHEROKEE SPIRITUALITY AND DAILY EXISTENCE LONG BEFORE THE MODERN CONCEPT OF BORDERS WAS EVEN CONCEIVED.

CHEROKEE SOCIETY AND CULTURE BEFORE EUROPEAN CONTACT

PRIOR TO SIGNIFICANT EUROPEAN INFLUENCE, CHEROKEE SOCIETY WAS HIGHLY ORGANIZED AND SOPHISTICATED. THEY LIVED IN SETTLED VILLAGES, OFTEN SITUATED ALONG RIVER VALLEYS, WHERE AGRICULTURE WAS THE PRIMARY ECONOMIC ACTIVITY. THEIR POLITICAL STRUCTURE WAS TRADITIONALLY CLAN-BASED, WITH A DECENTRALIZED SYSTEM OF GOVERNANCE. EACH VILLAGE HAD ITS OWN COUNCIL OF ELDERS, AND LEADERS EMERGED BASED ON WISDOM, EXPERIENCE, AND CONSENSUS RATHER THAN HEREDITARY SUCCESSION ALONE. THIS EMPHASIS ON COMMUNITY AND COLLECTIVE DECISION-MAKING WAS A DEFINING CHARACTERISTIC OF CHEROKEE GOVERNANCE.

CHEROKEE CULTURE WAS RICH AND VIBRANT, EXPRESSED THROUGH INTRICATE POTTERY, BASKET WEAVING, BEADWORK, AND STORYTELLING. THEIR SPIRITUAL BELIEFS WERE ANIMISTIC, RECOGNIZING THE SACREDNESS OF ALL LIVING THINGS AND THE NATURAL WORLD. CEREMONIES AND RITUALS PLAYED A VITAL ROLE IN THEIR LIVES, MARKING SEASONS, CELEBRATING HARVESTS, AND HONORING ANCESTORS. THE CHEROKEE LANGUAGE, A SIOUAN LANGUAGE, POSSESSED A COMPLEX GRAMMAR AND A RICH ORAL TRADITION THAT PRESERVED THEIR HISTORY, LAWS, AND MYTHOLOGY. THIS ERA LAID THE GROUNDWORK FOR THE REMARKABLE ADAPTATION AND DEVELOPMENT THEY WOULD LATER DISPLAY.

EARLY INTERACTIONS AND THE SHIFTING LANDSCAPE

THE ARRIVAL OF EUROPEANS, INITIALLY THE SPANISH AND LATER THE ENGLISH AND FRENCH, MARKED A PROFOUND TURNING POINT IN CHEROKEE HISTORY IN GEORGIA. EARLY INTERACTIONS WERE CHARACTERIZED BY A MIXTURE OF TRADE, DIPLOMACY, AND CONFLICT. THE CHEROKEE WERE INITIALLY EAGER TO ENGAGE IN TRADE, SEEKING EUROPEAN GOODS SUCH AS METAL TOOLS, FIREARMS, AND TEXTILES. IN RETURN, THEY OFFERED FURS, HIDES, AND AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS. THIS TRADE, WHILE BRINGING NEW TECHNOLOGIES AND GOODS, ALSO INTRODUCED DISEASES TO WHICH THE CHEROKEE HAD NO IMMUNITY, LEADING TO DEVASTATING POPULATION DECLINES.

AS EUROPEAN SETTLEMENTS EXPANDED, PARTICULARLY FROM THE BRITISH COLONIES, THE RELATIONSHIP BECAME INCREASINGLY COMPLEX AND OFTEN STRAINED. THE DEMAND FOR LAND BY COLONIAL GOVERNMENTS AND SETTLERS PUT IMMEDIATE PRESSURE ON CHEROKEE TERRITORIES. THE CHEROKEE, RECOGNIZING THE GROWING THREAT, ATTEMPTED TO FORGE ALLIANCES AND ENGAGE IN DIPLOMATIC NEGOTIATIONS TO PROTECT THEIR SOVEREIGNTY AND ANCESTRAL LANDS. THEY DEMONSTRATED REMARKABLE ADAPTABILITY, LEARNING EUROPEAN CUSTOMS AND EVEN ADOPTING ASPECTS OF THEIR POLITICAL AND AGRICULTURAL PRACTICES IN AN EFFORT TO COEXIST AND MAINTAIN THEIR WAY OF LIFE WITHIN THE EVOLVING COLONIAL LANDSCAPE.

THE RISE OF SEQUOYAH AND CHEROKEE CIVILIZATION

ONE OF THE MOST REMARKABLE ACHIEVEMENTS IN CHEROKEE HISTORY, AND INDEED IN NATIVE AMERICAN HISTORY, WAS THE DEVELOPMENT OF A WRITTEN LANGUAGE AND SYLLABARY BY SEQUOYAH, A CHEROKEE SCHOLAR AND CRAFTSMAN, AROUND 1821. LIVING WITHIN THE CONTEXT OF GEORGIA'S EVOLVING SOCIETAL STRUCTURES, SEQUOYAH OBSERVED THE POWER OF WRITTEN COMMUNICATION AMONG EUROPEANS AND DEDICATED HIMSELF TO CREATING A SIMILAR SYSTEM FOR HIS PEOPLE. HIS INVENTION, THE CHEROKEE SYLLABARY, CONSISTED OF 85 CHARACTERS, EACH REPRESENTING A DISTINCT SYLLABLE IN THE CHEROKEE LANGUAGE. THIS INNOVATION WAS REVOLUTIONARY, ENABLING WIDESPREAD LITERACY WITHIN THE CHEROKEE NATION.

THE IMPACT OF SEQUOYAH'S SYLLABARY WAS TRANSFORMATIVE. IT FACILITATED COMMUNICATION, THE SPREAD OF KNOWLEDGE, AND THE CREATION OF A DISTINCT CHEROKEE WRITTEN LITERATURE. THE CHEROKEE NATIONAL COUNCIL ADOPTED THE SYLLABARY, AND SOON NEWSPAPERS, BOOKS, AND LEGAL DOCUMENTS WERE BEING PRODUCED IN CHEROKEE. THIS LED TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A SOPHISTICATED CHEROKEE GOVERNMENT AND A THRIVING CULTURAL LIFE, OFTEN REFERRED TO AS THE "CHEROKEE RENAISSANCE." THE NATION DRAFTED A CONSTITUTION MODELED AFTER THAT OF THE UNITED STATES AND DEVELOPED A CENTRALIZED GOVERNMENT WITH LEGISLATIVE, EXECUTIVE, AND JUDICIAL BRANCHES. THIS PERIOD SHOWCASED THE CHEROKEE'S CAPACITY FOR INNOVATION AND THEIR ABILITY TO BUILD A MODERN CIVILIZATION, EVEN AMIDST INCREASING EXTERNAL PRESSURES.

THE ERA OF TREATIES, LAND CESSIONS, AND GROWING TENSIONS

THROUGHOUT THE LATE 18TH AND EARLY 19TH CENTURIES, THE CHEROKEE NATION IN GEORGIA FOUND ITSELF INCREASINGLY UNDER PRESSURE FROM THE BURGEONING UNITED STATES AND THE STATE OF GEORGIA. THE U.S. GOVERNMENT, DRIVEN BY WESTWARD EXPANSION AND A POLICY OF MANIFEST DESTINY, PURSUED A RELENTLESS AGENDA OF ACQUIRING NATIVE AMERICAN LANDS. TREATIES WERE NEGOTIATED, OFTEN UNDER DURESS OR THROUGH DECEPTIVE MEANS, RESULTING IN SUCCESSIVE CESSIONS OF CHEROKEE TERRITORY WITHIN GEORGIA.

THE CHEROKEE NATION, DESPITE ITS ADVANCEMENTS AND ITS ATTEMPTS AT PEACEFUL COEXISTENCE, FACED MOUNTING HOSTILITY. GEORGIA'S STATE GOVERNMENT, EAGER FOR CHEROKEE LANDS AND RESOURCES, ACTIVELY SOUGHT TO UNDERMINE CHEROKEE SOVEREIGNTY. LAWS WERE PASSED THAT DENIED CHEROKEE CITIZENS THE RIGHTS AFFORDED TO WHITE GEORGIANS AND ASSERTED GEORGIA'S JURISDICTION OVER CHEROKEE TERRITORY. THE CHEROKEE LEADERSHIP, INCLUDING PRINCIPAL CHIEF JOHN ROSS, ENGAGED IN PROLONGED DIPLOMATIC EFFORTS, APPEALING TO THE U.S. FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO UPHOLD TREATY OBLIGATIONS AND PROTECT CHEROKEE LANDS. HOWEVER, THESE EFFORTS WERE INCREASINGLY MET WITH INDIFFERENCE AND OUTRIGHT HOSTILITY FROM BOTH STATE AND FEDERAL AUTHORITIES.

THE INEVITABLE CONFLICT: GOLD FEVER AND THE INDIAN REMOVAL ACT

THE DISCOVERY OF GOLD ON CHEROKEE LAND IN DAHLONEGA, GEORGIA, IN 1829 IGNITED A FEVERISH SCRAMBLE FOR THE PRECIOUS METAL, INTENSIFYING THE PRESSURE TO REMOVE THE CHEROKEE. THIS INFLUX OF PROSPECTORS AND THE INSATIABLE DEMAND FOR LAND SHATTERED ANY SEMBLANCE OF PEACEFUL COEXISTENCE. GEORGIA'S STATE GOVERNMENT SEIZED UPON THE GOLD DISCOVERY AS A JUSTIFICATION FOR EXPEDITED REMOVAL, ENACTING LAWS THAT DECLARED CHEROKEE LAND FORFEIT AND ASSERTING STATE AUTHORITY OVER CHEROKEE AFFAIRS.

IN THIS CHARGED ATMOSPHERE, THE U.S. CONGRESS PASSED THE INDIAN REMOVAL ACT OF 1830, CHAMPIONED BY PRESIDENT ANDREW JACKSON. WHILE NOT EXPLICITLY MANDATING REMOVAL, THE ACT AUTHORIZED THE PRESIDENT TO NEGOTIATE TREATIES FOR THE VOLUNTARY EXCHANGE OF NATIVE AMERICAN LANDS EAST OF THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER FOR LANDS WEST OF IT. HOWEVER, THE "VOLUNTARY" NATURE OF THESE NEGOTIATIONS WAS LARGELY A PRETENSE, AS THE PRESSURE AND COERCION APPLIED TO TRIBES LIKE THE CHEROKEE MADE GENUINE CONSENT IMPOSSIBLE. THE ACT SET THE STAGE FOR THE TRAGIC EVENTS THAT WOULD FOLLOW, FOREVER ALTERING THE LANDSCAPE OF CHEROKEE IN GEORGIA HISTORY.

THE TRAGIC FORCED REMOVAL: THE TRAIL OF TEARS

THE CULMINATION OF DECADES OF PRESSURE, BROKEN TREATIES, AND POLITICAL MANEUVERING WAS THE DEVASTATING FORCED REMOVAL OF THE CHEROKEE NATION FROM THEIR ANCESTRAL HOMELANDS IN GEORGIA, AN EVENT FOREVER ETCHED IN HISTORY AS THE TRAIL OF TEARS. DESPITE THE ELOQUENT PROTESTS AND LEGAL BATTLES WAGED BY CHIEF JOHN ROSS AND HIS SUPPORTERS, WHO EVEN APPEALED TO THE SUPREME COURT AND WON THE LANDMARK CASE OF *WORCESTER V. GEORGIA* (1832), WHICH AFFIRMED CHEROKEE SOVEREIGNTY, PRESIDENT JACKSON FAMOUSLY DECLARED, "JOHN MARSHALL HAS MADE HIS DECISION; NOW LET HIM ENFORCE IT." THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, UNWILLING TO CHALLENGE GEORGIA AND DRIVEN BY EXPANSIONIST AMBITIONS, LARGELY IGNORED THE SUPREME COURT'S RULING.

UNDER THE TREATY OF NEW ECHOTA, SIGNED IN 1835 BY A SMALL, UNAUTHORIZED FACTION OF CHEROKEE WHO WERE BRIBED AND COERCED, THE CHEROKEE GOVERNMENT'S REMOVAL WAS SANCTIONED. THIS TREATY WAS OVERWHELMINGLY REJECTED BY THE VAST MAJORITY OF THE CHEROKEE PEOPLE. IN 1838, UNDER THE COMMAND OF GENERAL WINFIELD SCOTT, THE U.S. ARMY BEGAN THE SYSTEMATIC ROUNDUP OF CHEROKEE FAMILIES FROM THEIR HOMES ACROSS GEORGIA. THEY WERE ROUNDED UP AT GUNPOINT, OFTEN WITH LITTLE MORE THAN THE CLOTHES ON THEIR BACKS, AND FORCED TO GATHER IN STOCKADES. FROM THESE COLLECTION POINTS, THEY WERE MARCHED WESTWARD IN GRUELING JOURNEYS, ENDURING IMMENSE HARDSHIP, DISEASE, STARVATION, AND EXPOSURE. THOUSANDS PERISHED ALONG THE WAY, MAKING THE TRAIL OF TEARS A PROFOUND TRAGEDY OF BROKEN PROMISES AND EGREGIOUS HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS, FOREVER MARKING THE CHEROKEE IN GEORGIA HISTORY WITH IMMENSE SUFFERING.

CHEROKEE RESILIENCE AND REBUILDING AFTER REMOVAL

DESPITE THE IMMENSE TRAUMA AND LOSS INFLICTED BY THE TRAIL OF TEARS, THE CHEROKEE PEOPLE DEMONSTRATED EXTRAORDINARY RESILIENCE AND A REMARKABLE CAPACITY FOR REBUILDING. THOSE WHO SURVIVED THE ARDUOUS JOURNEY TO INDIAN TERRITORY (PRESENT-DAY OKLAHOMA) FACED THE DAUNTING TASK OF ESTABLISHING A NEW SOCIETY FROM SCRATCH. THEY CARRIED WITH THEM THEIR LAWS, THEIR GOVERNMENTAL STRUCTURE, AND THEIR CULTURAL TRADITIONS, DETERMINED TO PRESERVE THEIR IDENTITY AND HERITAGE.

THE CHEROKEE NATION IN OKLAHOMA QUICKLY RE-ESTABLISHED A FUNCTIONING GOVERNMENT, ADAPTING THEIR EXISTING INSTITUTIONS TO THEIR NEW ENVIRONMENT. THEY CONTINUED TO OPERATE SCHOOLS, DEVELOP AGRICULTURE, AND ENGAGE IN TRADE. THE LEGACY OF SEQUOYAH'S SYLLABARY PLAYED A CRUCIAL ROLE IN MAINTAINING NATIONAL UNITY AND CULTURAL CONTINUITY. WHILE THE WOUNDS OF REMOVAL RAN DEEP, THE CHEROKEE SPIRIT OF PERSEVERANCE AND SELF-DETERMINATION ALLOWED THEM TO NOT ONLY SURVIVE BUT TO THRIVE IN THEIR NEW HOMELAND, FORGING A NEW CHAPTER IN THEIR ENDURING NARRATIVE.

THE ENDURING CHEROKEE LEGACY IN GEORGIA

THOUGH THE MAJORITY OF THE CHEROKEE PEOPLE WERE FORCIBLY REMOVED FROM GEORGIA, THEIR PRESENCE AND IMPACT ON THE STATE'S HISTORY REMAIN UNDENIABLE. THE VERY NAMES OF MANY RIVERS, MOUNTAINS, AND TOWNS IN GEORGIA BEAR TESTAMENT TO THE CHEROKEE LANGUAGE AND THEIR DEEP CONNECTION TO THE LAND. THE FERTILE VALLEYS THEY CULTIVATED AND THE LANDSCAPES THEY SHAPED ARE STILL RECOGNIZABLE TODAY.

THE STORY OF THE CHEROKEE IN GEORGIA IS A VITAL COMPONENT OF THE STATE'S HISTORICAL NARRATIVE, A REMINDER OF THE COMPLEX AND OFTEN PAINFUL INTERACTIONS BETWEEN NATIVE AMERICAN TRIBES AND EXPANDING COLONIAL POWERS. THE LEGACY OF THEIR SOPHISTICATED CIVILIZATION, THEIR CULTURAL RICHNESS, AND THEIR ULTIMATE RESILIENCE IN THE FACE OF UNIMAGINABLE HARDSHIP CONTINUES TO INFORM OUR UNDERSTANDING OF GEORGIA'S PAST AND THE ONGOING IMPORTANCE OF ACKNOWLEDGING AND RESPECTING THE HISTORY AND CONTRIBUTIONS OF INDIGENOUS PEOPLES. THEIR STORY SERVES AS A POWERFUL LESSON IN PERSEVERANCE AND THE ENDURING STRENGTH OF CULTURAL IDENTITY.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT WAS THE PRIMARY GEOGRAPHIC AREA CHEROKEE NATION OCCUPIED IN GEORGIA?

BEFORE REMOVAL, THE CHEROKEE NATION'S TERRITORY IN GEORGIA ENCOMPASSED MUCH OF THE NORTHWESTERN PORTION OF THE STATE, INCLUDING AREAS AROUND THE ETOWAH RIVER, PRESENT-DAY CHATTANOOGA, AND EXTENDING SOUTH TOWARDS THE OCONEE RIVER.

WHAT WAS THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE CHEROKEE CAPITAL, NEW ECHOTA, IN GEORGIA?

NEW ECHOTA, LOCATED IN PRESENT-DAY GORDON COUNTY, GEORGIA, SERVED AS THE LAST CAPITAL OF THE CHEROKEE NATION. IT WAS A CENTER FOR GOVERNMENT, EDUCATION, AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE CHEROKEE SYLLABARY, BECOMING A SYMBOL OF CHEROKEE SOVEREIGNTY AND CULTURAL ACHIEVEMENT.

HOW DID THE DISCOVERY OF GOLD IN GEORGIA IMPACT THE CHEROKEE PEOPLE?

THE DISCOVERY OF GOLD IN 1829 IN DAHLONEGA, GEORGIA, ON CHEROKEE LAND, DRAMATICALLY ESCALATED TENSIONS AND DESIRES FOR CHEROKEE REMOVAL. THIS EVENT FUELED THE LAND LUST OF WHITE SETTLERS AND THE STATE GOVERNMENT, DIRECTLY LEADING TO INCREASED PRESSURE FOR THE CHEROKEE'S EXPULSION.

WHAT WAS THE INDIAN REMOVAL ACT AND ITS EFFECT ON CHEROKEE IN GEORGIA?

THE INDIAN REMOVAL ACT OF 1830, SIGNED BY PRESIDENT ANDREW JACKSON, AUTHORIZED THE FORCED REMOVAL OF NATIVE AMERICAN TRIBES, INCLUDING THE CHEROKEE, FROM THEIR ANCESTRAL LANDS. WHILE NOT EXCLUSIVELY TARGETING GEORGIA, IT PROVIDED THE LEGAL FRAMEWORK FOR THE SUBSEQUENT REMOVAL OF THE CHEROKEE FROM THE STATE.

WHAT WAS THE 'TRAIL OF TEARS' AND ITS CONNECTION TO GEORGIA?

THE 'TRAIL OF TEARS' REFERS TO THE FORCED MARCH OF THE CHEROKEE NATION FROM THEIR ANCESTRAL HOMELANDS, INCLUDING GEORGIA, TO DESIGNATED INDIAN TERRITORY IN PRESENT-DAY OKLAHOMA. THOUSANDS OF CHEROKEE DIED FROM DISEASE, STARVATION, AND EXPOSURE DURING THIS BRUTAL JOURNEY, WITH MANY OF THE INITIAL ROUNDUPS AND DEPARTURES OCCURRING IN GEORGIA.

WHO WERE SOME KEY CHEROKEE LEADERS DURING GEORGIA'S PRE-REMOVAL ERA?

PROMINENT CHEROKEE LEADERS DURING THIS PERIOD INCLUDED PRINCIPAL CHIEF JOHN ROSS, WHO TIRELESSLY ADVOCATED FOR THE CHEROKEE'S RIGHTS THROUGH LEGAL AND POLITICAL MEANS, AND ELIAS BOUDINOT, A KEY FIGURE IN DEVELOPING THE CHEROKEE PHOENIX NEWSPAPER AND ADVOCATING FOR ASSIMILATION AND MODERNIZATION.

WHAT ROLE DID THE CHEROKEE PHOENIX PLAY IN GEORGIA'S HISTORY?

THE CHEROKEE PHOENIX WAS THE FIRST BILINGUAL NEWSPAPER PUBLISHED BY NATIVE AMERICANS IN THE UNITED STATES, ESTABLISHED IN NEW ECHOTA, GEORGIA, IN 1828. IT SERVED AS A VITAL PLATFORM FOR DISSEMINATING CHEROKEE NEWS, ADVOCATING FOR THEIR RIGHTS, AND SHOWCASING THEIR CULTURAL AND INTELLECTUAL ADVANCEMENTS TO BOTH CHEROKEE AND NON-CHEROKEE AUDIENCES.

WHAT WERE THE LEGAL CHALLENGES THE CHEROKEE NATION MOUNTED AGAINST GEORGIA?

THE CHEROKEE NATION FAMOUSLY TOOK THEIR CASE TO THE U.S. SUPREME COURT. IN *WORCESTER V. GEORGIA* (1832), CHIEF JUSTICE JOHN MARSHALL RULED IN FAVOR OF THE CHEROKEE, ASSERTING THAT GEORGIA'S LAWS HAD NO FORCE WITHIN CHEROKEE TERRITORY. HOWEVER, PRESIDENT JACKSON FAMOUSLY IGNORED THE RULING, ALLOWING GEORGIA TO PROCEED WITH ITS PLANS FOR REMOVAL.

WHAT IS THE LEGACY OF THE CHEROKEE PRESENCE IN GEORGIA TODAY?
