REVOLUTIONARY WAR TRAITORS

INITIALLY A RESPECTED GENERAL IN THE CONTINENTAL ARMY, ARNOLD GREW DISILLUSIONED WITH THE REVOLUTIONARY CAUSE DUE TO PERCEIVED SLIGHTS AND FINANCIAL DIFFICULTIES. IN 1780, HE PLOTTED TO SURRENDER THE FORT AT WEST POINT, NEW YORK, TO THE BRITISH IN EXCHANGE FOR MONEY AND A COMMISSION IN THE BRITISH ARMY. HIS PLAN WAS UNCOVERED, FORCING HIM TO FLEE TO BRITISH LINES. ARNOLD'S NAME HAS SINCE BECOME SYNONYMOUS WITH BETRAYAL IN AMERICAN CULTURE.

MAJOR JOHN ANDRÉ

MAJOR JOHN ANDRÉ WAS A BRITISH ARMY OFFICER WHO COLLABORATED WITH BENEDICT ARNOLD DURING THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR. HE SERVED AS A LIAISON IN ARNOLD'S TREASONOUS PLOT TO HAND OVER WEST POINT. CAPTURED BY AMERICAN FORCES WHILE CARRYING INCRIMINATING DOCUMENTS, ANDRÉ WAS TRIED AND EXECUTED AS A SPY. HIS FATE UNDERSCORES THE HARSH CONSEQUENCES FACED BY THOSE INVOLVED IN ESPIONAGE DURING WARTIME.

JULIUS AND ETHEL ROSENBERG

ONE OF THE MOST CONTROVERSIAL CASES OF ALLEGED TREASON INVOLVED JULIUS AND ETHEL ROSENBERG, WHO WERE ACCUSED OF PASSING ATOMIC SECRETS TO THE SOVIET UNION DURING WORLD WAR II. THEIR TRIAL AND EXECUTION IN 1953 SPARKED INTENSE DEBATE OVER THE FAIRNESS OF THEIR CONVICTION AND THE EXTENT OF THEIR GUILT. THE ROSENBERGS REMAIN A POTENT SYMBOL OF COLD WAR PARANOIA AND THE HIGH STAKES OF ESPIONAGE.

ALDRICH AMES

ALDRICH AMES WAS A CIA OFFICER WHO BETRAYED HIS COUNTRY BY SPYING FOR THE SOVIET UNION AND LATER RUSSIA. HANSSEN'S CAPTURE IN 2001 WAS CONSIDERED ONE OF THE MOST SERIOUS INTELLIGENCE FAILURES IN AMERICAN HISTORY, AND HE WAS SENTENCED TO LIFE IMPRISONMENT WITHOUT PAROLE.

JONATHAN POLLARD

JONATHAN POLLARD, A CIVILIAN INTELLIGENCE ANALYST FOR THE U.S. NAVY, WAS CONVICTED OF SPYING FOR ISRAEL IN THE 1980S. THOUGH MOTIVATED BY IDEOLOGICAL SUPPORT FOR ISRAEL RATHER THAN AN ENEMY STATE, POLLARD'S ACTIONS WERE CLASSIFIED AS ESPIONAGE AND TREASONOUS BY THE U.S. GOVERNMENT. HIS CASE STIRRED DIPLOMATIC TENSIONS AND RAISED QUESTIONS ABOUT LOYALTY AND THE COMPLEXITIES OF INTERNATIONAL ALLIANCES.
