THE MEXICAN CESSION AND ITS AFTERMATH

FOLLOWING THE MEXICAN CESSION, MEXICAN POPULATIONS IN THE NEWLY ACQUIRED TERRITORIES FACED SIGNIFICANT CHALLENGES. CULTURAL IDENTITY AND EXPRESSION

THEY OFTEN DIRECTLY CONFRONT THE "FOREIGNERS IN THEIR OWN LAND" THEME, USING ART AS A VEHICLE FOR SOCIAL COMMENTARY AND CULTURAL AFFIRMATION.

THE POLITICS OF BELONGING AND RESISTANCE
