HISTORICAL CONTEXT OF HAVING OUR SAY THE DELANY SISTERS

HAVING OUR SAY THE DELANY SISTERS IS SET AGAINST A BACKDROP OF SIGNIFICANT SOCIAL AND RACIAL CHANGES IN AMERICAN HISTORY. THE SISTERS WERE BORN IN THE LATE 19TH AND EARLY 20TH CENTURIES, A TIME MARKED BY SEGREGATION, JIM CROW LAWS, AND LIMITED OPPORTUNITIES FOR AFRICAN AMERICANS. PROGRESSIVE FAMILY BACKGROUND

THE DELANY SISTERS WERE RAISED IN A FAMILY THAT VALUED EDUCATION AND ACTIVISM. THE BIOGRAPHIES OF THE DELANY SISTERS

SARAH LOUISE DELANY AND ANNIE ELIZABETH DELANY, AFFECTIONATELY KNOWN AS SADIE AND BESSIE, LED REMARKABLE LIVES THAT DEFIED SOCIAL NORMS OF THEIR ERA. THEIR PERSONAL HISTORIES ARE CENTRAL TO UNDERSTANDING THE DEPTH AND

AUTHENTICITY OF HAVING OUR SAY THE DELANY SISTERS. BOTH WOMEN PURSUED PROFESSIONAL CAREERS AT A TIME WHEN AFRICAN AMERICAN WOMEN FACED TREMENDOUS OBSTACLES.

SARAH LOUISE DELANY (SADIE)

BORN IN 1889, SADIE DELANY BECAME THE FIRST AFRICAN AMERICAN WOMAN TO TEACH DOMESTIC SCIENCE AT THE HIGH SCHOOL LEVEL IN NEW YORK CITY. HER CAREER SPANNED SEVERAL DECADES, DURING WHICH SHE ADVOCATED FOR EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR AFRICAN AMERICANS. SADIE'S EXPERIENCES REFLECT THE BROADER STRUGGLES AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF AFRICAN AMERICAN EDUCATORS IN THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY.

ANNIE ELIZABETH DELANY (BESSIE)

BESSIE DELANY WAS BORN IN 1891 AND BROKE RACIAL AND GENDER BARRIERS BY BECOMING ONE OF THE FIRST AFRICAN AMERICAN FEMALE DENTISTS IN NEW YORK. HER PROFESSIONAL SUCCESS AND DEDICATION TO CIVIL RIGHTS ACTIVISM ILLUSTRATE THE POSSIBILITIES FOR AFRICAN AMERICAN WOMEN DESPITE THE LIMITATIONS IMPOSED BY SOCIETY. BESSIE'S LIFE STORY COMPLEMENTS SADIE'S, TOGETHER FORMING A POWERFUL NARRATIVE OF PERSEVERANCE AND ACHIEVEMENT.
