ORIGINS AND COMPOSITION OF THE BIBLE

THE OLD TESTAMENT

THE OLD TESTAMENT IS A COMPILATION OF VARIOUS GENRES INCLUDING HISTORICAL NARRATIVE, LAW CODES, POETRY, PROPHECY, AND WISDOM LITERATURE. THESE TEXTS WERE WRITTEN PRIMARILY IN HEBREW, WITH SOME PORTIONS IN ARAMAIC, REFLECTING THE LINGUISTIC AND CULTURAL ENVIRONMENT OF THE ANCIENT NEAR EAST. THE NEW TESTAMENT

COMPOSED IN KOINE GREEK, THE NEW TESTAMENT INCLUDES FOUR GOSPELS, THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES, VARIOUS EPISTLES (LETTERS), AND THE BOOK OF REVELATION. THESE WRITINGS EMERGED FROM THE EARLY CHRISTIAN COMMUNITIES AND WERE AUTHORED BY FIGURES SUCH AS PAUL, JOHN, LUKE, AND MATTHEW. THE HISTORICAL OF THE BIBLE'S NEW TESTAMENT HIGHLIGHTS THE THEOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENTS AND THE SPREAD OF CHRISTIANITY DURING THE ROMAN EMPIRE.

MANUSCRIPTS AND TRANSMISSION

HISTORICAL CONTEXT AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL EVIDENCE

IT WAS WIDELY USED IN THE HELLENISTIC JEWISH COMMUNITIES AND EARLY CHRISTIANITY. THE LATIN VULGATE, TRANSLATED BY JEROME IN THE LATE 4TH CENTURY CE, BECAME THE AUTHORITATIVE BIBLE VERSION FOR THE WESTERN CHURCH FOR MANY CENTURIES.

MODERN TRANSLATIONS

SINCE THE REFORMATION, NUMEROUS TRANSLATIONS HAVE BEEN PRODUCED IN VERNACULAR LANGUAGES, INCLUDING THE KING JAMES VERSION, THE NEW INTERNATIONAL VERSION, AND MANY OTHERS. THESE TRANSLATIONS REFLECT ADVANCES IN BIBLICAL SCHOLARSHIP, MANUSCRIPT DISCOVERIES, AND CHANGING LINGUISTIC STANDARDS.

INFLUENCE OF HISTORICAL EVENTS ON THE BIBLE

THE COUNCILS AND CANON FORMATION

CHURCH COUNCILS IN THE 4TH AND 5TH CENTURIES CE, SUCH AS THE COUNCIL OF NICAEA AND THE COUNCIL OF CARTHAGE, PLAYED CRUCIAL ROLES IN DEFINING THE BIBLICAL CANON. THESE COUNCILS DETERMINED WHICH BOOKS WERE CONSIDERED AUTHORITATIVE SCRIPTURE, REFLECTING THEOLOGICAL AND ECCLESIASTICAL CONSENSUS.
