EARLIEST LITERARY REFERENCES

ONE OF THE EARLIEST KNOWN LITERARY REFERENCES TO ROBIN HOOD IS FOUND IN THE 1377 POEM "PIERS PLOWMAN," WHICH MENTIONS "ROBYN HODE" AS A SYMBOL OF LAWLESSNESS. FOREST LAW, DISTINCT FROM COMMON LAW, GOVERNED ROYAL FORESTS AND WAS OFTEN HARSHLY ENFORCED, CRIMINALIZING HUNTING AND GATHERING BY LOCALS.
