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EARLY CIVILIZATIONS AND THE ORIGINS OF URBAN SOCIETY

THE HISTORY OF THE ANCIENT NEAR EAST BEGINS WITH SOME OF THE EARLIEST KNOWN HUMAN URBAN SETTLEMENTS AND STATE FORMATIONS. THEIR CITY-STATES WERE CHARACTERIZED BY MONUMENTAL ARCHITECTURE SUCH AS ZIGGURATS, SOPHISTICATED IRRIGATION SYSTEMS, AND COMPLEX SOCIAL HIERARCHIES. KINGS AND PRIESTS HELD SIGNIFICANT POWER, OFTEN JUSTIFIED THROUGH DIVINE AUTHORITY.

GEOGRAPHICAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONTEXT

THE RISE AND FALL OF MESOPOTAMIAN EMPIRES

IT EXPANDED THE REACH OF MESOPOTAMIAN CULTURE AND INTRODUCED NEW ADMINISTRATIVE TECHNIQUES. THE BABYLONIAN EMPIRE

THE BABYLONIAN EMPIRE IS FAMOUS FOR ITS CULTURAL ACHIEVEMENTS AND LEGAL INNOVATIONS, ESPECIALLY UNDER KING HAMMURABI, WHO CODIFIED ONE OF THE EARLIEST KNOWN LAW CODES. THE ASSYRIAN EMPIRE

KNOWN FOR ITS MILITARY PROWESS AND ADMINISTRATIVE EFFICIENCY, THE ASSYRIAN EMPIRE CONTROLLED VAST TERRITORIES ACROSS THE NEAR EAST DURING THE FIRST MILLENNIUM BCE. THE EMPIRE'S CAPITAL CITIES, INCLUDING NINEVEH AND ASHUR, WERE CENTERS OF LEARNING AND CULTURE. THE ASSYRIANS ALSO CONTRIBUTED SIGNIFICANTLY TO ART, LITERATURE, AND TECHNOLOGY.

CULTURAL AND TECHNOLOGICAL INNOVATIONS
