THEORETICAL FOUNDATIONS OF UNIVERSAL HUMAN RIGHTS

PRACTICAL IMPLEMENTATION AND CHALLENGES

WHILE THE THEORETICAL FOUNDATIONS OF UNIVERSAL HUMAN RIGHTS ARE WELL-ESTABLISHED IN DONNELLY'S ANALYSIS, THEIR PRACTICAL IMPLEMENTATION PRESENTS SIGNIFICANT CHALLENGES. DONNELLY'S DEFENSE OF UNIVERSALITY
