UNDERSTANDING ASL FUNDAMENTALS

FAMILY AND EMOTIONS

SIGNS RELATED TO FAMILY MEMBERS AND EMOTIONS ENABLE LEARNERS TO EXPRESS PERSONAL INFORMATION AND FEELINGS. TIME AND TENSE INDICATORS
