MAJOR GODS AND GODDESSES OF ANCIENT GREECE

CHTHONIC AND PRIMORDIAL DEITIES

BEYOND THE OLYMPIANS, ANCIENT GREEK MYTHOLOGY ALSO INCLUDES CHTHONIC GODS ASSOCIATED WITH THE UNDERWORLD, SUCH AS HADES AND PERSEPHONE, AS WELL AS PRIMORDIAL DEITIES LIKE GAIA (EARTH) AND URANUS (SKY), WHO EMBODY THE EARLIEST COSMIC ELEMENTS. THESE FIGURES ARE INTEGRAL TO UNDERSTANDING THE COSMOS AND THE ORIGIN STORIES PREVALENT IN GREEK MYTHS.

FAMOUS HEROES AND THEIR LEGENDARY QUESTS

SYMBOLISM OF MONSTERS
