THIS INQUIRY CHALLENGES THE DIVINE COMMAND THEORY AND PROBES THE NATURE OF ETHICAL STANDARDS INDEPENDENT OF DIVINE APPROVAL. SOCRATES' DIALECTICAL METHOD EXPOSES THE AMBIGUITY AND DIFFICULTY IN DEFINING PIETY, THUS SETTING THE PHILOSOPHICAL FOUNDATION FOR HIS OWN DEFENSE DURING THE TRIAL.

THE TRIAL OF SOCRATES: CHARGES AND DEFENSE

THE TRIAL OF SOCRATES FORMS THE CENTERPIECE OF PLATO THE TRIAL AND DEATH OF SOCRATES EUTHYPHRO AND IS VIVIDLY RECOUNTED IN THE DIALOGUE "APOLOGY." SOCRATES FACED TWO PRIMARY CHARGES: IMPIETY (ASEBEIA) AND CORRUPTING THE YOUTH OF ATHENS. THE TRIAL REFLECTS THE TENSION BETWEEN SOCRATIC PHILOSOPHY AND THE DEMOCRATIC AUTHORITIES OF ATHENS FOLLOWING THE PELOPONNESIAN WAR.

IN HIS DEFENSE, SOCRATES REJECTS THE ACCUSATIONS AND ARGUES FOR THE VALUE OF HIS PHILOSOPHICAL MISSION. HE ASSERTS THAT HIS QUESTIONING SERVES THE POLIS BY ENCOURAGING CRITICAL EXAMINATION OF MORAL BELIEFS. RATHER THAN PLEADING FOR ACQUITTAL, SOCRATES REMAINS STEADFAST IN HIS PRINCIPLES, FAMOUSLY DECLARING THAT "THE UNEXAMINED LIFE IS NOT WORTH LIVING." HIS DEFENSE IS BOTH A LEGAL AND PHILOSOPHICAL STATEMENT, EMPHASIZING THE PURSUIT OF TRUTH OVER POPULAR OPINION.

THE DEATH OF SOCRATES: PHILOSOPHICAL SIGNIFICANCE

SOCRATES DISCUSSES THE NATURE OF THE AFTERLIFE AND ARGUES THAT A TRUE PHILOSOPHER SHOULD NOT FEAR DEATH, AS IT IS A TRANSITION OF THE SOUL TO A BETTER EXISTENCE. SOCRATES WAS CHARGED WITH IMPIETY—SPECIFICALLY, NOT RECOGNIZING THE GODS OF THE CITY—AND CORRUPTING THE YOUTH OF ATHENS THROUGH HIS TEACHINGS AND QUESTIONING.

How does Socrates defend himself during his trial in Plato's 'Apology'?
