COMMON POULTRY DISEASES

BACTERIAL DISEASES

BACTERIAL INFECTIONS IN POULTRY INCLUDE DISEASES SUCH AS COLIBACILLOSIS, FOWL CHOLERA, AND MYCOPLASMOSIS. THESE ILLNESSES OFTEN RESULT IN RESPIRATORY DISTRESS, REDUCED EGG PRODUCTION, AND INCREASED MORTALITY IF UNTREATED.

- **COLIBACILLOSIS:** CAUSED BY *ESCHERICHIA COLI*, LEADING TO SEPTICEMIA AND AIRSACCULITIS.
- **FOWL CHOLERA:** CAUSED BY *PASTEURELLA MULTOCIDA*, CHARACTERIZED BY SWOLLEN WATTLES AND SUDDEN DEATH.
- **MYCOPLASMOSIS:** RESPIRATORY DISEASE CAUSED BY *MYCOPLASMA GALLISEPTICUM* WITH SYMPTOMS LIKE COUGHING AND NASAL DISCHARGE.

VIRAL DISEASES

VIRAL INFECTIONS POSE SIGNIFICANT CHALLENGES DUE TO THEIR CONTAGIOUS NATURE AND LIMITED TREATMENT OPTIONS. NOTABLE VIRAL DISEASES INCLUDE NEWCASTLE DISEASE, INFECTIOUS BRONCHITIS, AND AVIAN INFLUENZA.

PARASITIC DISEASES

- **EXTERNAL PARASITES:** LICE AND MITES CAUSE SKIN IRRITATION AND FEATHER DAMAGE.
- **INTERNAL PARASITES:** WORMS LIKE ROUNDWORMS AND CECAL WORMS AFFECT THE DIGESTIVE TRACT.

DIAGNOSTIC METHODS FOR POULTRY DISEASES

ACCURATE DIAGNOSIS IS THE CORNERSTONE OF EFFECTIVE POULTRY DISEASES DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT. VARIOUS DIAGNOSTIC TECHNIQUES HELP IDENTIFY THE CAUSATIVE AGENTS AND DETERMINE THE SEVERITY OF INFECTION.

TREATMENT STRATEGIES FOR POULTRY DISEASES

EFFECTIVE TREATMENT DEPENDS ON THE ACCURATE DIAGNOSIS OF THE DISEASE AND UNDERSTANDING ITS ETIOLOGY. POULTRY DISEASES DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT INVOLVE THE USE OF MEDICATIONS, SUPPORTIVE CARE, AND MANAGEMENT ADJUSTMENTS.

ANTIBIOTIC THERAPY

ENVIRONMENTAL AND NUTRITIONAL MANAGEMENT
