ADDITIONAL TOOLS

CHOOSING THE APPROPRIATE MOUNT

STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE TO PRACTICE MOUNTING DENTAL X RAYS

INSERTING FILMS INTO MOUNTS

INSERT EACH RADIOGRAPH CAREFULLY INTO THE CORRESPONDING SLOT OF THE MOUNT BASED ON TOOTH NUMBER AND TYPE OF VIEW (BITEWING, PERIAPICAL, ETC.). ARRANGE THE FILMS IN A LOGICAL ORDER THAT REFLECTS THE PATIENT'S DENTAL ARCH, USUALLY STARTING FROM THE UPPER RIGHT QUADRANT AND PROCEEDING CLOCKWISE. LABELING AND DOCUMENTATION

AFTER MOUNTING, LABEL THE MOUNT CLEARLY WITH THE PATIENT'S NAME, DATE OF EXPOSURE, AND ANY RELEVANT NOTES. THIS DOCUMENTATION FACILITATES EASY RETRIEVAL AND REFERENCE DURING CLINICAL ASSESSMENTS. STORE MOUNTED X RAYS PROPERLY TO PROTECT THEM FROM LIGHT, MOISTURE, AND PHYSICAL DAMAGE.

VERIFICATION

POOR IMAGE QUALITY

MOUNTING FILMS WITH POOR CONTRAST, FOGGING, OR ARTIFACTS REDUCES DIAGNOSTIC VALUE. ENSURE PROPER EXPOSURE AND PROCESSING BEFORE MOUNTING. REPEAT RADIOGRAPHS IF NECESSARY TO MAINTAIN DIAGNOSTIC STANDARDS.
