THIS RELIANCE ON AGRICULTURE, AND THE LABOR-INTENSIVE NATURE OF THESE CROPS, CONTRIBUTED DIRECTLY TO THE ENTRENCHMENT OF SLAVERY AS A CORNERSTONE OF THE SOUTHERN ECONOMY AND SOCIETY. THE WEST, A MORE DIVERSE AND EVOLVING REGION, OFTEN FOUND ITSELF CAUGHT BETWEEN THE COMPETING INTERESTS OF THE NORTH AND SOUTH, INFLUENCING ITS OWN DEVELOPING IDENTITY AND POLITICAL ALLEGIANCES.

ECONOMIC DIVERGENCES AND SECTIONAL TENSIONS

SOCIAL AND CULTURAL DIFFERENCES ACROSS REGIONS

THESE STARK SOCIAL AND CULTURAL DIFFERENCES MADE UNDERSTANDING AND COMPROMISE INCREASINGLY DIFFICULT BETWEEN THE REGIONS.

SOUTHERNERS ARGUED THAT INDIVIDUAL STATES RETAINED SIGNIFICANT POWERS NOT EXPLICITLY DELEGATED TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, INCLUDING THE RIGHT TO DETERMINE THE LEGALITY OF SLAVERY WITHIN THEIR BORDERS. THIS BELIEF DIRECTLY CONTRASTED WITH THE NORTHERN VIEW OF A STRONGER FEDERAL UNION WITH A NATIONAL GOVERNMENT POSSESSING ULTIMATE AUTHORITY ON CERTAIN ISSUES.

IMPACT OF TARIFFS ON SECTIONAL RELATIONS

TARIFFS, TAXES ON IMPORTED GOODS, WERE ANOTHER SIGNIFICANT SOURCE OF SECTIONAL STRIFE. NORTHERN INDUSTRIALISTS GENERALLY SUPPORTED HIGH TARIFFS TO PROTECT THEIR YOUNG INDUSTRIES FROM FOREIGN COMPETITION, MAKING AMERICAN GOODS MORE ATTRACTIVE. HOWEVER, SOUTHERN PLANTERS, WHO RELIED HEAVILY ON IMPORTED MANUFACTURED GOODS AND EXPORTED AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS, VIEWED THESE TARIFFS AS UNFAIR. THEY ARGUED THAT TARIFFS RAISED PRICES FOR CONSUMERS IN THE SOUTH AND COULD PROVOKE RETALIATORY TARIFFS FROM OTHER COUNTRIES ON SOUTHERN EXPORTS, HARMING THEIR ECONOMY. THE NULLIFICATION CRISIS OF THE 1830s, IN WHICH SOUTH CAROLINA DECLARED FEDERAL TARIFFS NULL AND VOID WITHIN ITS BORDERS, EXEMPLIFIES THE INTENSE OPPOSITION TO TARIFF POLICIES FROM THE SOUTH AND THE ASSERTION OF STATES' RIGHTS.

ROLE OF WESTWARD EXPANSION IN EXACERBATING SECTIONALISM

WESTWARD EXPANSION, WHILE SEEMINGLY A FORCE FOR NATIONAL UNITY AND OPPORTUNITY, PARADOXICALLY INTENSIFIED SECTIONAL TENSIONS. AS NEW TERRITORIES WERE ACQUIRED, THE QUESTION OF WHETHER THEY WOULD ENTER THE UNION AS FREE OR SLAVE STATES BECAME A PARAMOUNT CONCERN. EACH NEW STATE ADMITTED TO THE UNION COULD SHIFT THE BALANCE OF POWER IN CONGRESS, INFLUENCING FUTURE LEGISLATION AND THE NATIONAL DEBATE OVER SLAVERY. THE FUGITIVE SLAVE ACT, PART OF THE COMPROMISE OF 1850, FURTHER INFLAMED SECTIONAL PASSIONS BY REQUIRING CITIZENS IN FREE STATES TO ASSIST IN THE CAPTURE OF RUNAWAY SLAVES, DEEPLY RESENTED IN THE NORTH.

KEY COMPROMISES AND THEIR LIMITATIONS

SEVERAL COMPROMISES WERE ENACTED IN AN ATTEMPT TO QUELL SECTIONALIST FIRES AND PRESERVE THE UNION. THESE INCLUDED:

- THE MISSOURI COMPROMISE OF 1820: ADMITTED MISSOURI AS A SLAVE STATE AND MAINE AS A FREE STATE, AND PROHIBITED SLAVERY IN TERRITORIES NORTH OF THE 36°30' PARALLEL.
- THE COMPROMISE OF 1850: A PACKAGE OF FIVE SEPARATE BILLS THAT ADDRESSED SLAVERY AND TERRITORIAL EXPANSION, ADMITTING CALIFORNIA AS A FREE STATE, STRENGTHENING THE FUGITIVE SLAVE ACT, AND ALLOWING POPULAR SOVEREIGNTY IN THE UTAH AND NEW MEXICO TERRITORIES.
- THE KANSAS-NEBRASKA ACT OF 1854: REPEALED THE MISSOURI COMPROMISE AND ALLOWED RESIDENTS OF KANSAS AND NEBRASKA TERRITORIES TO DECIDE ON SLAVERY THROUGH POPULAR SOVEREIGNTY, LEADING TO VIOLENT CONFLICT IN "BLEEDING KANSAS."

WHILE THESE COMPROMISES PROVIDED TEMPORARY REPRIEVES, THEY ULTIMATELY FAILED TO ADDRESS THE FUNDAMENTAL MORAL AND ECONOMIC CONFLICTS SURROUNDING SLAVERY AND DID LITTLE TO BRIDGE THE GROWING CHASM BETWEEN THE NORTH AND THE SOUTH.

THE CULMINATION OF SECTIONALISM: THE ROAD TO THE CIVIL WAR

THE DRED SCOTT DECISION AND ITS AFTERMATH

THE SUPREME COURT'S DRED SCOTT V. SANDFORD DECISION IN 1857 WAS A WATERSHED MOMENT. THE COURT RULED THAT AFRICAN AMERICANS, WHETHER ENSLAVED OR FREE, COULD NOT BE CITIZENS AND HAD NO RIGHT TO SUE IN FEDERAL COURT. THIS DECISION WAS A MAJOR VICTORY FOR THE SOUTH AND A SEVERE BLOW TO THE ABOLITIONIST MOVEMENT, FURTHER POLARIZING THE NATION AND HARDENING OPINIONS ON BOTH SIDES.

THE ELECTION OF 1860 AND SECESSION
