THIS IS A POWERFUL STATEMENT OF SELF-WORTH AND DEFIANCE AGAINST THE DEHUMANIZING STEREOTYPES OFTEN ASSOCIATED WITH NATIVE AMERICANS. JUNIOR IS ASSERTING HIS FUNDAMENTAL RIGHT TO HAVE ASPIRATIONS, DESIRES, AND A LIFE OF MEANING, JUST LIKE ANYONE ELSE, REGARDLESS OF HIS BACKGROUND.

HOW DOES THE QUOTE, 'YOU HAVE TO BE BRAVE TO BE A STUDENT,' REFLECT THE CHALLENGES JUNIOR FACES?

THIS QUOTE UNDERSCORES THE IMMENSE COURAGE IT TAKES FOR JUNIOR TO LEAVE THE FAMILIAR (ALBEIT DIFFICULT) ENVIRONMENT OF THE RESERVATION AND ATTEND AN ALL-WHITE SCHOOL. HE FACES PREJUDICE, ISOLATION, AND THE FEAR OF THE UNKNOWN, MAKING HIS PURSUIT OF EDUCATION A TESTAMENT TO HIS BRAVERY AND DETERMINATION.

WHAT IS THE UNDERLYING MESSAGE IN THE QUOTE, 'MY HOPE WAS THAT IF I COULD TEACH MYSELF TO BELIEVE IN MYSELF, THEN MAYBE I COULD SURVIVE.'?

THIS QUOTE HIGHLIGHTS THE THEME OF SELF-EMPOWERMENT AND RESILIENCE. JUNIOR UNDERSTANDS THAT EXTERNAL VALIDATION OR CIRCUMSTANCES MAY NOT ALWAYS BE FAVORABLE, SO HE RECOGNIZES THE CRUCIAL IMPORTANCE OF DEVELOPING INNER STRENGTH AND SELF-BELIEF AS THE KEY TO NAVIGATING HIS CHALLENGING CIRCUMSTANCES AND ACHIEVING PERSONAL GROWTH.
