THE ROLE OF ALCOHOLISM IN HIS DOWNFALL

THE PERVERSITY AS A DRIVING FORCE

SYMBOLISM OF THE BLACK CAT: PLUTO AND HIS SUCCESSOR

THE BLACK CAT, OR CATS, IN EDGAR ALLAN POE'S STORY ARE FAR MORE THAN MERE ANIMALS; THEY ARE POTENT SYMBOLS THAT EVOLVE THROUGHOUT THE NARRATIVE, REFLECTING THE NARRATOR'S INTERNAL STATE AND THE CONSEQUENCES OF HIS ACTIONS. THE SECOND BLACK CAT: A MANIFESTATION OF THE NARRATOR'S INNER TORMENT

THE APPEARANCE OF A SECOND BLACK CAT, IDENTICAL TO PLUTO EXCEPT FOR A WHITE MARK ON ITS CHEST, IS DEEPLY UNSETTLING.
