DISCUSSION QUESTIONS MIGHT FOCUS ON THE ETHICS OF CONTROL, THE VALUE OF HUMAN EXPERIENCE, AND THE POWER OF STORYTELLING IN SHAPING A COMMUNITY.

2. *FAHRENHEIT 451*

IN THIS CLASSIC SCIENCE FICTION WORK, BOOKS ARE OUTLAWED AND BURNED BY "FIREMEN" AS THEY ARE SEEN AS DANGEROUS OBJECTS THAT PROMOTE INDEPENDENT THOUGHT. THE PROTAGONIST, A FIREMAN, BEGINS TO QUESTION HIS ROLE AND SEEKS OUT A HIDDEN SOCIETY OF BOOK LOVERS. THIS BOOK POWERFULLY EXPLORES THEMES OF CENSORSHIP, THE IMPORTANCE OF LITERATURE, AND THE FIGHT FOR INTELLECTUAL FREEDOM.

3. *TO KILL A MOCKINGBIRD*

SET IN THE AMERICAN SOUTH DURING THE DEPRESSION, THIS NOVEL TELLS THE STORY OF SCOUT FINCH AND HER FATHER, ATTICUS, A LAWYER WHO DEFENDS A BLACK MAN FALSELY ACCUSED OF RAPE. THE BOOK TACKLES ISSUES OF RACISM, PREJUDICE, JUSTICE, AND MORAL COURAGE THROUGH THE EYES OF A CHILD. DISCUSSION QUESTIONS OFTEN REVOLVE AROUND EMPATHY, STANDING UP FOR WHAT'S RIGHT, AND THE COMPLEXITIES OF SOCIAL INJUSTICE.

4. *THEIR EYES WERE WATCHING GOD*

THIS NOVEL FOLLOWS THE JOURNEY OF JANIE CRAWFORD, A BLACK WOMAN IN FLORIDA, AS SHE NAVIGATES LOVE, INDEPENDENCE, AND SELF-DISCOVERY IN THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY. HER QUEST FOR HER OWN VOICE AND IDENTITY IS CENTRAL TO THE NARRATIVE, EXPLORING THEMES OF RACE, GENDER, AND PERSONAL AGENCY. IT IS A STORY ABOUT FINDING ONE'S VOICE AND LIVING LIFE ON ONE'S OWN TERMS.

5. *THE COLOR PURPLE*

WRITTEN AS A SERIES OF LETTERS FROM CELIE TO GOD, THIS POWERFUL NOVEL CHRONICLES THE LIFE OF A YOUNG, ABUSED BLACK WOMAN IN THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY AMERICAN SOUTH. IT ADDRESSES THEMES OF RACISM, SEXISM, VIOLENCE, AND THE RESILIENCE OF THE HUMAN SPIRIT AS CELIE FINDS HER OWN STRENGTH AND VOICE. THE BOOK IS A TESTAMENT TO SURVIVAL AND THE TRANSFORMATIVE POWER OF SISTERHOOD.

6. *A TREE GROWS IN BROOKLYN*

THIS SEMI-AUTOBIOGRAPHICAL NOVEL DEPICTS THE STRUGGLES OF YOUNG FRANCIE NOLAN AND HER FAMILY AS THEY LIVE IN POVERTY IN EARLY 20TH-CENTURY BROOKLYN. IT BEAUTIFULLY PORTRAYS THE RESILIENCE OF THE HUMAN SPIRIT, THE IMPORTANCE OF EDUCATION, AND THE SEARCH FOR HOPE IN DIFFICULT CIRCUMSTANCES. DISCUSSION MIGHT EXPLORE FAMILY DYNAMICS, SOCIAL MOBILITY, AND THE POWER OF INDIVIDUAL DETERMINATION.

7. *MIDNIGHT IN THE GARDEN OF GOOD AND EVIL*

THIS NON-FICTION BOOK OFFERS A CAPTIVATING LOOK INTO THE ECCENTRICITIES AND DARK UNDERBELLY OF SAVANNAH, GEORGIA, THROUGH A MURDER INVESTIGATION. IT BLENDS JOURNALISTIC REPORTING WITH STORYTELLING, EXPLORING THEMES OF SOUTHERN GOTHIC, CLASS, AND THE BLURRED LINES BETWEEN GOOD AND EVIL. QUESTIONS COULD CENTER ON THE NATURE OF TRUTH, SOCIETAL FACADES, AND THE IMPACT OF PLACE ON IDENTITY.

8. *ANNE OF GREEN GABLES*

THE BELOVED STORY OF ANNE SHIRLEY, AN IMAGINATIVE AND SPIRITED ORPHAN GIRL, WHO IS ACCIDENTALLY SENT TO LIVE WITH SIBLINGS MARILLA AND MATTHEW CUTHBERT ON PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND. ANNE'S JOURNEY IS ONE OF FINDING BELONGING, OVERCOMING PREJUDICE, AND CULTIVATING A LOVE FOR BEAUTY AND LEARNING. DISCUSSION MIGHT FOCUS ON CHILDHOOD INNOCENCE, THE POWER OF IMAGINATION, AND THE FORMATION OF COMMUNITY.

9. *THE SECRET LIFE OF BEES*

THIS NOVEL FOLLOWS LILY OWENS, A YOUNG WHITE GIRL FLEEING ABUSE, WHO FINDS REFUGE WITH THREE BLACK BEEKEEPING SISTERS IN SYLVAN, SOUTH CAROLINA. IT EXPLORES THEMES OF RACE RELATIONS, MOTHERHOOD, FORGIVENESS, AND THE SEARCH FOR BELONGING IN THE POST-CIVIL RIGHTS ERA SOUTH. DISCUSSION QUESTIONS OFTEN DELVE INTO THEMES OF PREJUDICE, FINDING FAMILY IN UNEXPECTED PLACES, AND PERSONAL HEALING.
