THE ERUPTION OF MOUNT VESUVIUS AND ITS IMPACT ON POMPEII

THE SEQUENCE OF THE ERUPTION

THE ERUPTION BEGAN WITH A MASSIVE COLUMN OF ASH AND PUMICE THAT DARKENED THE SKY FOR HOURS. THIS INITIAL PHASE CAUSED ROOFS TO COLLAPSE UNDER THE ACCUMULATING PUMICE, TRAPPING MANY RESIDENTS INDOORS. THE SPEED AND INTENSITY OF THE ERUPTION MEANT THAT POMPEII WAS ALMOST INSTANTLY TRANSFORMED FROM A BUSTLING CITY TO A GHOST TOWN.
