HISTORY AND ORIGIN OF THE PETERS PROJECTION WORLD MAP

THE PETERS PROJECTION WORLD MAP WAS DEVELOPED BY ARNO PETERS, A GERMAN HISTORIAN AND CARTOGRAPHER, IN 1974. IT WAS INTRODUCED AS AN ALTERNATIVE TO THE MERCATOR PROJECTION, WHICH HAD BEEN THE DOMINANT WORLD MAP PROJECTION SINCE THE 16TH CENTURY.
