

THE SLAVE SHIP JMW TURNER 1

THE SLAVE SHIP JMW TURNER 1 STANDS AS ONE OF THE MOST POWERFUL AND HAUNTING WORKS IN THE HISTORY OF BRITISH ART. CREATED BY THE RENOWNED ARTIST JOSEPH MALLORD WILLIAM TURNER IN 1840, THIS PAINTING CAPTURES THE TRAGIC EVENT OF A SLAVE SHIP CAUGHT IN A STORM, SYMBOLIZING THE HORRORS OF THE TRANSATLANTIC SLAVE TRADE. HISTORICAL CONTEXT OF THE SLAVE SHIP

THE SLAVE SHIP JMW TURNER 1 WAS PAINTED DURING A TIME WHEN THE TRANSATLANTIC SLAVE TRADE WAS A DEEPLY CONTENTIOUS ISSUE IN BRITAIN. ALTHOUGH THE BRITISH PARLIAMENT HAD ABOLISHED THE SLAVE TRADE IN 1807, SLAVERY ITSELF WOULD NOT BE ABOLISHED IN THE BRITISH COLONIES UNTIL 1833. TURNER'S PAINTING REFLECTS THE LINGERING MORAL OUTRAGE AND THE HUMAN SUFFERING CAUSED BY THE TRADE. THE PAINTING IS BASED ON THE TRUE STORY OF THE ZONG MASSACRE IN 1781, WHERE ENSLAVED AFRICANS WERE THROWN OVERBOARD BY THE CREW TO CLAIM INSURANCE MONEY. THIS HISTORICAL INCIDENT BECAME A PIVOTAL MOMENT FOR ABOLITIONISTS AND DEEPLY INFLUENCED CONTEMPORARY ART AND LITERATURE.
