JULIET FAKES HER DEATH USING A POTION TO ESCAPE AN UNWANTED MARRIAGE, A PLAN DEVISED WITH FRIAR LAURENCE. THIS ACT IS FILLED WITH SUSPENSE AS THE CHARACTERS MOVE TOWARD THE CLIMAX.

ACT V: TRAGIC CONCLUSION

MISCOMMUNICATION LEADS TO THE DEATHS OF ROMEO AND JULIET IN THE CAPULET TOMB. THE FAMILIES RECONCILE IN THE AFTERMATH, BUT THE COST IS HEARTBREAK AND LOSS. THE FINAL ACT DELIVERS THE PLAY'S POWERFUL MESSAGE ABOUT LOVE AND FATE.
