UNDERSTANDING THE AP US HISTORY EXAM STRUCTURE

SHORT ANSWER QUESTIONS

SHORT ANSWER QUESTIONS TYPICALLY REQUIRE STUDENTS TO RESPOND TO PROMPTS WITH CONCISE, EVIDENCE-BASED ANSWERS. THESE QUESTIONS OFTEN FOCUS ON SPECIFIC EVENTS, PERIODS, OR HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENTS AND ASSESS THE ABILITY TO RECALL FACTS AND DEMONSTRATE UNDERSTANDING OF CAUSE AND EFFECT RELATIONSHIPS IN HISTORY.

DOCUMENT-BASED QUESTION (DBQ)

THE DBQ IS A CRITICAL COMPONENT OF THE EXAM, REQUIRING STUDENTS TO ANALYZE AND SYNTHESIZE INFORMATION FROM A SET OF HISTORICAL DOCUMENTS. STUDENTS MUST CONSTRUCT A WELL-ORGANIZED ESSAY THAT INTEGRATES THE PROVIDED DOCUMENTS WITH THEIR OWN KNOWLEDGE OF HISTORY. THIS SECTION TESTS CRITICAL THINKING, ANALYTICAL WRITING, AND

LONG ESSAY QUESTIONS (LEQs)

LEQs REQUIRE STUDENTS TO WRITE EXTENDED RESPONSES TO PROMPTS THAT FOCUS ON SIGNIFICANT HISTORICAL THEMES OR PERIODS. THESE ESSAYS ASSESS THE ABILITY TO DEVELOP A CLEAR THESIS SUPPORTED BY RELEVANT EVIDENCE AND HISTORICAL REASONING. STUDENTS SHOULD BE PREPARED TO COMPARE DIFFERENT TIME PERIODS, ANALYZE CAUSES AND EFFECTS, OR EVALUATE HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENTS.

CHRONOLOGICAL PERIODS AND KEY THEMES
