QUESTIONING AS A COGNITIVE SKILL

NOT ALL QUESTIONS CARRY EQUAL WEIGHT. PRIORITIZING THOSE THAT ADDRESS CORE ISSUES OR CRITICAL GAPS IN UNDERSTANDING MAXIMIZES THE EFFECTIVENESS OF INQUIRY. THIS APPROACH ENSURES EFFICIENT USE OF COGNITIVE RESOURCES.

PRACTICE ACTIVE LISTENING
