SIMON OF CYRENE

SIMON OF CYRENE, MENTIONED IN THE GOSPELS (MARK 15:21, MATTHEW 27:32, LUKE 23:26), WAS COMPELLED TO CARRY JESUS' CROSS. COMING FROM CYRENE, AN ANCIENT CITY IN LIBYA, SIMON REPRESENTS THE AFRICAN PRESENCE IN THE NEW TESTAMENT AND EXEMPLIFIES ACTS OF SERVICE AND COMPASSION IN THE BIBLICAL NARRATIVE.

SYMBOLISM OF BLACKNESS IN BIBLICAL TEXTS

HISTORICAL CONTEXT OF BLACK PRESENCE IN THE BIBLE
