AFRICAN AND AFRICAN-AMERICAN FOLKLORE ROOTS

BRER RABBIT ORIGINATES FROM THE TRICKSTER FIGURE FOUND IN WEST AFRICAN FOLKLORE, SUCH AS THE HARE IN YORUBA AND ASHANTI TRADITIONS. THESE TRICKSTER ANIMALS WERE KNOWN FOR THEIR INTELLIGENCE AND RESOURCEFULNESS, OFTEN USING CUNNING TO OVERCOME STRONGER OPPONENTS. JOEL CHANDLER HARRIS AND THE UNCLE REMUS STORIES

JOEL CHANDLER HARRIS, A JOURNALIST AND WRITER, COLLECTED AND PUBLISHED MANY OF THESE FOLKTALES IN THE LATE 1800s. HIS "UNCLE REMUS" STORIES PRESENTED THE ADVENTURES OF BRER RABBIT, BRER FOX, AND OTHER CHARACTERS THROUGH THE VOICE OF AN ELDERLY AFRICAN-AMERICAN STORYTELLER. WHILE HARRIS'S WORK HELPED PRESERVE THESE TALES, IT HAS ALSO BEEN CRITIQUED FOR ITS PORTRAYAL OF AFRICAN-AMERICAN DIALECTS AND CULTURAL CONTEXT. NONETHELESS, HIS COLLECTIONS REMAIN A KEY SOURCE FOR UNDERSTANDING THE FOLKLORE OF BRER RABBIT AND BRER FOX.

CHARACTERISTICS OF BRER RABBIT AND BRER FOX

THE DEFINING TRAITS OF BRER RABBIT AND BRER FOX SET THEM APART WITHIN THE FOLKLORE TRADITION. BRER RABBIT'S CUNNING AND TRICKSTER NATURE
